### **DETAILS**

#### **CRITERIA**

Nominees should “demonstrate strong innovative methods of thinking and effectively work on behalf of their constituents, the people of New England and the nation.” Nominees may serve at any level and must possess a demonstrated commitment to the ideals of public service.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Any member of the Washington, district or committee staff of the New England Congressional delegation, regardless of party, is eligible. *A written endorsement by the Member is required.*

#### **SELECTION:**

A panel of New England Federal Executives and the Moakley family reviews and scores each nomination. The recipient is invited to participate in our Excellence in Government Awards, held annually in May at the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library in Boston to accept the award.
